### 4. How we protect your personal data

LAYC staff will ensure that all data held by LAYC is:

- Fairly and lawfully processed;
- Processed for limited purposes;
- Adequate, relevant and not excessive;
- Accurate;
- Not kept longer than necessary;
- Processed in accordance with the data subject's rights;
- Secure
- 4.1 LAYC will not transfer your personal data to 3rd parties without your consent.
- 4.2 LAYC have implemented appropriate technical and organisational measures to protect your personal data.
- 4.3 For subscribers to the Bulletin LAYC use a recognised secure mailing list provider (MailChimp) to process your information online. More information about their data processing practices can be found at https://mailchimp.com/en-gb/help/data-privacy/

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- 4.4 For members of LAYC the information provided when joining is held securely by LAYC in order to give effect to all the advice, information, support and training services that the group would expect to access as a benefit of their membership.
- 4.5 LAYC will notify you promptly in the unfortunate event of any breach of your personal data which might expose you to serious risk.

### 5. Who else has access to the information you provide us?

- 5.1 The information provided by a group joining LAYC is supplied via Youth Scotland's secure Microsoft Dynamics 365 Customer Records Management system. Youth Scotland retains this information for the purpose of making available the Youth Scotland services the group is eligible for as an LAYC member.
- 5.2 LAYC don't share your personal data with any other third parties, unless required to do so by law.

#### 6. How long do we keep your information?

6.1 LAYC will hold your personal data for as long as you are a subscriber. We only maintain your information for as long as it is necessary to enable us to comply with any legal obligations we may have.

#### 7. Your rights

- 7.1 You have rights under GDPR:
- (a) to access the personal data we hold about you;
- (b) to be provided with information about how your personal data is processed;
- (c) to have your personal data corrected;
- (d) to have your personal data erased in certain circumstances;
- (e) to object to or restrict how your personal data is processed;
- (f) to have your personal data transferred to yourself or to another business in certain circumstances.
