Commitment: One year from the completion of volunteer training

Role

Space at Youth Befriending provides one-to-one befriending for children and young people aged 5-16 though supporting them to learn new skills and provide a social experience for children and young people who are experiencing difficulties in their lives due to parental drug and alcohol use. Through the befriending relationship the child / young person and the befriender may touch on topics such as increasing self-esteem; dealing with worries; respect for others, with the main aim of building a trusting and reliable relationship with an adult and working towards set outcomes.

Key Tasks

- Organise and undertake weekly activities with a young person, including collecting them from their home or school and returning them home safely to their parent / carers.
- Build a relationship with a young person that is focused on their needs and abilities which is focused around set outcomes.
- Support and encourage the child or young person's personal and social development.
- Help the child or young person to increase self-esteem and confidence through praise and recognition.
- Create opportunities for the young person to experience new activities and develop their interests.
- Reviewing children / young people involvement in the befriending by providing Detailed Records on the child / young person following each session.

Specific Requirements

- Must be 18 years or older.
- No qualifications are necessary, as full volunteer training will be provided.
- Experience of spending time with children and young people is desirable.
- Some knowledge of the current issues affecting children and young people and their families.
- Good communication skills with children, young people and families.
- An ability to recognise positive qualities and skills that a child or young person may have.

• Commitment to endeavour to resolve in a fair and just manner any problems, grievances or difficulties that may be encountered while you volunteer with us.

5. Policies/Procedures

• All work undertaken by volunteers is covered by The Broomhouse Hub Volunteer Policy. Volunteering work will be underpinned in each organisational Policies/Procedures.

6. Criminal Record Checks

• All volunteer roles are subject to an Enhanced Protecting Vulnerable Groups Check. Please note Volunteering work cannot commence until this check is completed.
